Argentina in international news this month:

President Macri nominates Foreign Minister Malcorra as candidate for UN Secretary-General & launches long-term plan to boost renewable energy production

President Macri's nomination of Foreign Minister Susana Malcorra to the position of UN Secretary-General was widely reported in media across the world. News reports highlight her "passion" for the UN, her considerable experience in both the private sector and multilateral organizations (El País), and her success over the last 6 months in "reinserting Argentina into the world" (El Mercurio). In a wide-ranging Associated Press interview shortly after her nomination, Malcorra calls for an "issue-centric" and "inspirational" UN, rather than one driven by its organizational arrangements.

The world's media also reported on Argentina's 1,000 MW renewable energy auction designed "to expand Argentina's efforts to fight climate change and diversify Argentina's power mix" (Bloomberg). Focusing more on renewable energy will avoid the release of almost two million tons of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere annually, the equivalent to the pollution caused by around 900,000 cars (Xinhua). The auction is expected to attract around US\$2.1 billion in investments.

"Our country has enormous potential

to produce wind and solar energy," Macri said. "In just a few months we expect to receive a ton of bids from all over the world" (Wall Street Journal).

Media in the Americas also picked on US Commerce Secretary Penny Pritzker's comments at the 46th Conference of the Americas in early May. Ms Pritzker praised the government's strong commitment to kick-start the country's economy, citing the country's return to international markets and compilation of reliable economic statistics, as positive trends (O Globo).

In an interview with Spanish newspaper La Razón, Juan Schiaretti, the Peronist governor of Argentina's most populous province, Cordoba, highlighted Argentina's pragmatic approach to reintegration with the world and lack of prejudice when it comes to strengthening its bilateral relations with all countries. The newspaper highlighted his convictions that "Argentine trades unions don't want Macri to fail," that inflation will decrease in the second half of 2016, and more jobs will be become available.

Axion Energy announces investment of over US\$1.8bn, generating 1,600 jobs

"This investment is part and parcel of the work we are doing to build trust and employment opportunities", said Cabinet Chief Marcos Peña at the announcment. The project comprises US\$1.5 million of direct investment by Axion Energy and a further US\$378 million investment by the International Finance Corporation (IFC), the private sector lending arm of the World Bank. Unilever announces investment of over AR\$4.8 million and 400 new jobs

Dutch multinational Unilever presented an investment plan of AR\$4.8 million over the next 4 years, designed to increase the productive capacities of its plants in Argentina and develop sustainable infrastructure projects which will bring 400 new jobs. Read more

Pampa Energía announces investment of US\$400 million

The investment has been earmarked to development wind and thermal energy. The company is looking to generate an additional 120MW in thermal energy and embark on projects to generate between 150MW and 200MW in the southern part of Buenos Aires province.



Pampa Energía buys local Petrobras subsidiary for US\$892 million

The Brasilian energy giant Petrobras produces 2.5% of Argentina's hydrocarbons: 1,978 cubic metres of crude oil per day and over 7.35 million cubic metres of gas per day. It has a network of service stations across the country and a refinery in Bahía Blanca which which provides around 6% of petrol sold in the country. Read more

Tacabal Agroindustria announces US\$31 million investment in sugar cane bioethanol for Salta province

The investment will allow its subsidiary Alconoa to increase its bioethanol production from sugar cane from 70 to 144 million litres per year. Read more
